10 Facts About Your Flamingo Flock

- 1. Flamingos are born gray or white and it can take up to 3 years to turn pink, red or orange.
- 2. Eating shrimplike crustaceans turns the flamingos pink, red and orange.
- 3. Flamingos hold their bills upside down while feeding to filter out the food in the water.
- 4. Flamingos can fly as fast as 35 miles per hour.
- 5. A flock of flamingos is called a stand, colony or flamboyance.
- 6. Colonies of Flamingos can be thousands in number.
- 7. Flamingos do not do well on their own. When you see them at the zoo, you will see dozens living together.
- 8. Flamingos can live for 25-30 years in the wild.
- 9. Pink flamingo lawn ornaments were designed by Don Featherstone in 1957.
- 10. This invention started the tradition of installing a flamboyance of flamingos in friend's yards when they were not expecting it!
